The Board of Studies (BoS) is constituted with senior academicians, industrialists and alumni for framing the syllabus. The curriculum is reviewed by the CRC and then recommended by the Academic Council (constituted with experts from premier institutes). Typically, the BoS and AC meets at least twice a year as per UGC norms.
