
## **▶** Opening Remarks: Dr. Jayen Thaker, Master of Ceremonies

- The way Atmiya University incorporates the concept of harmony in curriculum, extracurricular activities, research and innovation.




### > Welcome Address: Prof. Dr. Shiv Tripathi, Vice-Chancellor
